Assessment Determination

If any species is categorised as Endangered or Critically Endangered on IUCN's Red List, or if it appears in the CITES appendices, it cannot be approved for use as Marin trust raw material. John Dory (*Zeus faber*) do not appear as Endangered or Critically Endangered on IUCN's Red List, nor do they appear in CITES appendices; therefore, Zeus faber is eligible for approval for use as Marin trust by-product raw material.

One stock is part of this assessment:

1) *Zeus faber* in Celtic sea, Western Channel and Northern Bay of Biscay (Divisions VIIe-j and VIII a,b) and the Western Iberian waters (Division IXa).

There are no management measures specifically implemented for the John Dory stock. The species is mainly caught in mixed fisheries. Catch-per-unit-effort (CPUE) series are available for this species.

Therefore, following Marin Trust criteria, the species is assessed as Category D.

Table D1 (PSA) shows that the stock has an average productivity at 2.16 and the susceptibility at 2.2. The average for the PSA risk rating results that the species passes.

Therefore, John Dory in the area ICES Celtic sea, Western Channel and Northern Bay of Biscay (Divisions VIIe-j and VIII a,b) and the Western Iberian waters (Division IXa) is **APPROVED** for the production of fishmeal and fish oil under the current Marin Trust v 2.0 by-products standard.

Fishery Assessment Peer Review Comments

The assessor correctly classified John Dory in the area ICES Celtic sea, Western Channel and Northern Bay of Biscay (Divisions VIIe-j and VIII a,b) and the Western Iberian waters (Division IXa) stock as category D, reference points are undefined to assess status of the stock relative to.

With an average productivity score of 2.16 and an average susceptibility score of 2.2, it passes as per Table D3.

Therefore, John Dory in the area ICES Celtic sea, Western Channel and Northern Bay of Biscay (Divisions VIIe-j and VIII a,b) and the Western Iberian waters (Division IXa) is **APPROVED.**

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Species Categorisation

IUCN Redlist Category

In the case of mixed trawl fisheries, Category D species may make up the majority of landings. The comparative lack of scientific information on the status of the population of the species means that a risk-assessment style approach must be taken.
